In Koforidua, where the GHVN is based, volunteers are greatly needed. Koforidua is the capital of the Central Region in Ghana. Typically government funding is scarce in this region. For that reason, the schools, public programs, and people in the region are in need. As a volunteer you can make a difference.

Pre-arrival Documents – you will receive further information about your project and Ghana prior to your arrival in the country.

Accommodations – Staying in our volunteer dorm, you will have the chance to live with up to 9 volunteer from all over the world. You can make friends with like-minded volunteer from other countries. The dorm has three single sex rooms, furnished with bunk beds. There is plenty of space to hang out.

Meals – Breakfast and dinner are provided daily, by the local cook in the dormitory.

In Country Orientation and a City Tour - As a volunteer on our program you will participate in orientation and take a tour of Koforidua. You will learn about the culture, history, and local customs in Ghana. During your tour you will see the sights of Koforidua, the market, have a local lunch, and learn to use the local transportation (tro-tros and taxis). By the end of the day you will know the best place for lunch, where the banks are, and how to buy anything that you may need during your stay.

Volunteer Placement - GHVN will arrange a rewarding project for you. We work closely with our projects, so that we can make sure that you are having a great time, while making a difference.

24 Hour in Country Support – Your volunteer coordinator is available to you 24 hours a day in the case of an emergency. In addition to this you will see your coordinator daily as the local office is located within the dormitory where you will be living.

Social Activities – You will have a great time socializing with other volunteers and Ghanaians. Your arrival weekend will be full of social activities. Besides orientation and a city tour, friends and staff will accompany you out to a local restaurant for dinner. Also there is a special activity planned for you on Sunday.

Letter of Completion – Everyone’s resume needs that extra something. Volunteering is a great way to make your resume stand out. We provide you with a letter of completion that you can provide your school or future employer.

Project Details

Teaching English

Volunteering at a rural elementary school or orphanage in Koforidua is a rewarding experience. Teachers need help with teaching English, despite it being the official. Ghanaians speak tribal languages at home and many students leave school without mastering English. Speaking English is a requirement for finding a good job; so many Ghanaians find themselves struggling.

Your role as an assistant English teacher is to help with pronunciation and intonation. Local teachers are well versed in the grammatical aspect of the language, but appreciate help with conversational skills. You do not need to be a professional teacher; just your participation in the program will encourage students. Support the teacher, by creating opportunities for the children to practice their speaking and listening skills.

In addition to helping with the English class, you may be asked to help in other subjects. Since all classes are taught in English, your participation in a Math or Science class is to help the children improve their pronunciation of words related to the subjects that they are learning in class, as well as the basic concepts. If you have a particular subject that you are interested in helping with, let the enrollment officer known while you are booking your program.

Teaching Sports

If you are a sports enthusiastic, teaching sports is the project for you. On this project we do not need a professional teacher or coach, but a volunteer who loves to play sports. In Ghana many athletes from other region of Ghana, are sponsored by their schools, families, and sporting establishments. These athletes are more likely to be given the opportunity to play sports professionally. This option is not probable for great athletes in Koforidua.

Volunteers can help change this in Koforidua, by participating in our sports program. You can teach the students the rules of the game as well as play with them. Demonstrate how to play the game and let them show you what they can do! Teach your favorites sport. Some of the sports previous volunteers have taught include: football/soccer, hockey, basketball, baseball, tennis, badminton, track and field, and volleyball.

The main tasks you will complete in the project are: planning theoretical lessons, assisting the teachers to set up for sports classes, teaching the students new techniques, setting up and participating in local tournaments, and encouraging the children to get active.

- Dress Code:
 - Classroom – teachers are highly respected members of the community in Ghana. Dress smart and modestly.
 - On the Field – wear lightweight modest sportswear. Short shorts and tank tops are not appropriate for an educational setting.
- Materials – Plan on improvising in regards to equipment and facilities. Feel free to bring equipment to use while you are teaching sports. If you would like to fundraise or bring donations, please contact the enrollment officer before doing so.

Child Care Projects

As a volunteer you will be working in one of the many non-government based orphanages in Koforidua. The main task you will complete is being a supportive, affectionate, and comforting role model for the children. In addition to spending time with the children, the orphanage also has a school where you will be asked to help with the classes. Volunteers help with basic classes in English, Math, Reading, and life skills.

The children living in these orphanages are fortunate to be provided for and even have access to education. But the staff is unable to provide as much one-on-one attention as they would like. Volunteers, who take the time to share and give their love to the children, are greatly appreciated.

While volunteering you will be doing the following tasks: playing with the children; feeding and cleaning the toddlers; checking to see that all the children complete their chores; helping the teachers during school hours; teaching English as well as other subjects; playing sports and recreational activities with the children; assisting with homework; helping in the kitchen and serving meals; and organize activities for the children. When school is not in session it is essential to come prepared to organize activities to entertain the kids.

- Age Requirements – 17 +, younger volunteers are welcome in a group
- Minimum Duration – 2 weeks
- Dress Code – casual and conservative clothing, you are a role model for the children. It is important to dress with this in mind.
- Work Schedule – Monday to Thursday 4-6 hours per day
 - During the School Year
 - You have two options during the school day
 - Help with the classes, assist the teachers in subjects like English, Math and Geography
 - Help with daily tasks of the orphanage, including cooking, cleaning, serving meals, and caring for the children on breaks
 - School Holidays
 - Children will be at the orphanage all day. This time of the year volunteer's assistance is really needed.

Health Care

Volunteers in this program will be volunteering in one of two hospitals in Koforidua. You will be placed in the department, which you specialize in. Departments that you can work in include general ward, maternity, accident and emergency, nursing and dentistry, orthopedics, pharmacy, surgery, and physical therapy.

While volunteering you will be working below the department head, with a member of hospital staff. All volunteers will have the opportunity to work with local doctors, medical students, and patients.

You also can choose to volunteer in multiple departments during your volunteer program. A medical student would highly benefit from several placements. A four week placement in each department is necessary for this opportunity.

Experience first-hand how doctors and nurse work in a developing country like Ghana. You will see patients with diseases uncommon in your own country. There may be different techniques and procedures that you are unfamiliar with, keep an open mind.

To take part in this project you will need to show that you are a medical student or work in the medical field.

- Language Requirements – Advanced English
- Dress Code – Professional dress is the norm in Ghanaian hospitals. You will be expected to follow the hospital dress code.
